1 Chronicles 29:1-13

Dear Family and Friends of Woodbury Lutheran,

Ashley, Judah, and I want to take a moment to pause with you, and together say, “Look at how great our God is!” As our family prepares to move to St. Louis, MO to follow Ashley’s call from Lutheran Hour Ministries (LHM.org), we pause to consider all of the ways that our God has grown us, sustained us, and blessed us while here at WLC.

King David of the Old Testament would do this from time-to-time. He would pause and point to the One who had done it; the One who was Greatest! Let me provide a brief word-picture of such pausing and praising from King David’s life, found in 1 Chronicles 29. In this passage, King David has assembled all of the people of Israel in one place, the place where the temple of the LORD would soon be constructed. The king had all the people of Israel bring gifts that would be used in building the impending temple. As David and his son Solomon watch the fathers of households, the leaders of tribes, and the commanders of thousands and of hundreds lay gifts of gold, silver, bronze and iron at their feet, David did not pause and say, “Look at how great the people are!” He did not pause and say, “Look at how great the gifts that the people have given, are.” No, instead, King David looks up to heaven and prays to the LORD before the whole assembly, and says, “LOOK AT HOW GREAT OUR GOD IS!”

David pauses and prays:

“Blessed are You, O LORD, the God of Israel our father, forever and ever. Yours O LORD, is the glory and the victory and the majesty, for all that is in the heavens and in the earth is yours. Yours is the kingdom, O LORD, and You are exalted as head above all. Both riches and honor come from You, and You rule over all. In Your hand are power and might, and in Your hand it is to make great and to give strength to all. And now we thank You, our God, and praise Your glorious name.” -- **1 Chronicles 29:10-13**

OAK HILL UPDATES

Here are some quick updates from our Oak Hill Campus:

- In February we started two financial classes. We have 32 people going through Financial Peace University and another 15 going through a class called Smart Money/Smart Kids. This class is teaching parents how to intentionally raise kids with wisdom around finances.
- We had a family tubing day at Green Acres with 32 family members enjoying.
- We have two of our small groups walking with a refugees family with Sadiyo and her 6 kids that came in December. This past month we hosted a welcome dinner which 46 people came to.
- We have been blessed by Jyl Dunavan making the switch to leading music at this campus and has been a great transition.
- One of our small groups has been praying for the past two years for a family and last month we baptized two of their children.
- This next month we are going to do something a little different and host a Maundy Thursday worship and dinner weaving both of them together. On Good Friday we are going to host a kids focused Good Friday experience at 4pm.
- We continue to celebrate the great things the Holy Spirit is doing on this campus.

THE GIFT OF WORSHIP

Think of someone you know. How do you know that person? What do you know about him or her? Knowing someone means you've taken time to learn who she is and have heard her story. You've learned what her preferences are, what she likes to do, and how she reacts to certain things. This all comes about by intentionally pursuing and spending time with this person, which is how deep, meaningful relationships form.

When I think of the people I know, I often think about the time it took to really get to know them. We've engaged in countless conversations, shared meals, played games, hiked, cried, and laughed together. The more I've gotten to know these special people, the deeper and richer our friendships have become. Over the time it takes to cultivate relationships, we trust the other people with more and more of ourselves. The trust grows stronger the more we get to know each other.

As parents, our children know us because we are with them daily. We take care of them, we protect them, we teach them, and we love them. This is like the relationship God has with us. When we spend time developing a relationship with Him, we discover His true character and learn to trust Him more and more. As we share ourselves with Him, He speaks truth into our inmost beings and reveals certain gifts within us. This intimacy fills us with joy, and our response is to worship!

There are many ways we can worship God when we know His character and His delight in us. Fortunately, for me, they go beyond singing on Sunday mornings (I'm a terrible singer). God made us to be creative people. We reflect God when we create. My own form of expression is through the arts, specifically dance. I often use this form of creativity as a way to uniquely share the gospel. When I come before Him with an open heart and posture as I turn, jump, and wave my arms fluidly, my dance creates a beautiful story using movement.

"God has given each of you a gift from his great variety of spiritual gifts. Use them well to serve one another."

1 Peter 4:10 (NLT)

Whatever gifts God has given you can be used to worship God and know Him more. God created this beautiful world in His image. What we create can be used to worship Him. This month, as a family, discuss some ways to worship God together. Consider using the creative gifts He has given you. Remind your family that worship is a way to spend time with God, get to know Him better, and respond to His love for you. Put on some worship music and use your gifts to honor God. Sing, dance, draw, or paint in response to the words you hear. Pray together and thank God that He has created each of us with gifts that we can use to worship Him and know Him more.
